- 2000 hazel rods
- 725 sweet chestnut posts
- 280 tonnes washed gravel
- 148 retweets on Twitter
- 136 volunteer man-days
- 102 cans of soup
- 18 hinged (or pleached) willows
- 17 inflated lifejackets
- 11 log deflectors
- 9 brushwood mattresses
- 7 project partners
- 2 visits to A&E
- 2 channel re-alignments
