



### 'Public Space, Activity & Security'

Set behind the houses on Moorside Road this development will create a strong link between the Downham Fields and the nearby Urban Retail Square on Downham Way. Through careful consideration of the relationship between Public and Private spaces the design ensures that active interior functions interact directly with the spaces surrounding the building. These visual links and their overlooking nature provide high natural levels of policing and security, add to a sense of place and give a strong feeling of activity and community.

The central court area is the main focus of the building. It is here that the outside meets inside and all activities, both in and out conceptually meet. This relationship focuses activity to create a vibrant, exciting and secure internal Civic Plaza.




#### **PAVING MATERIALS**



Pedestrian piazza

Good quality, durable, stone aggregate slabs, stone trim. Marshalls Perfecta range, natural colour, 450x450mm.



Car park areas.

Tarmacadam aisles with concrete pavior parking bays. Bays delineated with 'T' in silver grey paviors. Disabled parking features dropped kerb element.

Asphalt with resin bound gravel aggregate surfacing. Full height concrete kerb.

'S' Seating. Vandal resistant Norfolk style benches. 1800mm length. By Wales and Wales.


'C' Cycle stands. Fin stainless steel stands, by Furnitubes.

'P' Building collonade.






SECTION: EAST-WEST, THROUGH GARDENS IN DOWNHAM WAY





#### 'Public Space, Activity & Security'

The lower site consists of approximately 19 acres of green space and is about 300m South of the upper site in Downham. It is to be enhanced to provide an attractive facility for both the local community and wildlife, subtly divided into three character areas:

A Naturalistic Park (North of the Brook) - an informal landscaped area which will provide ever changing interest and colour from early spring to late summer.

Sports fields (South of the Brook) - Existing fields will be maintained with new pitch layouts marked out. Occasional trees will be planted to provide relief and shelter from winds.

The Brook - The existing line of waterside trees West of Glenbow Road will be extended and completed.

New community facilities will also be provided offering centrally located facilities for sports pitch users, a park ranger, children play, and dog walkers.


